Studying The Qur'ān Together

About the Forum:

This Forum meeting aims to explore the issues surrounding the collaborative study of The Qur'ān (Mushaf). Given the importance of the holy scripture for guidance through life, it has been a subject of intense study by the faithful throughout the ages. There may be special benefits from conducting such a study together in a group of people who are devoted to seeking the truth and living by it. With the rise of the tools for online meetings and sharing of information it has become easier to establish and conduct study groups across geographical and temporal boundaries.

We hope to use this opportunity to share experiences of past and ongoing study groups and establish guidelines for best practice in the hope that better opportunities for collective study of the Qur'ān may become available for all those who look for it.

A wide range of issues could be explored at the Forum such as: What should we look for in joining or establishing a study group? What would be a sensible criterion for being admitted to a study group? How to deal with disagreements and divergent views? What would be an ideal pace for covering the Mushaf? What translation(s) to use? How to cope with intermittent attendance? Etc.

About the Contributors:

We are hoping to learn from each other's experience of study groups in this Forum meeting. Some AMR alumni have already offered to speak about their experience of collective study. There will be time for comments, questions and answers. In addition, if you wish to report on your experience of study groups which you have been involved with, please let us know by emailing AMR with a brief paragraph indicating what you wish to bring up. The facilitators can then try to make sure you will have time to share your experience.
